2023 Florida Legislative Session wrap up

The 2023 Florida Legislative Session Legislative wrapped up May 5. During this session FSPA maintained an active and influential presence in the Florida Capitol. FSPA was involved in several

legislative negotiations, gaining adoption of FSPA supported amendments and further building FSPA's relationships with key policy makers in Tallahassee.

This year a total of 1,828 bills were filed, of which 185 were passed by the legislature. So far Governor DeSantis has signed 73 bills into law, leaving 112 bills remaining for approval or veto by the governor.

Several bills which will positively affect the Florida swimming pool and spa industry passed this session. SB 360 by the Senate Judiciary Committee has passed and approved by Gov. DeSantis. SB 360 is a tort reform bill aimed at limiting construction defect claims by reducing the statute of limitations for latent defects claims from 10 years after the issuance of certificate of completion to seven years after the issuance of the certificate of completion. The new statute of limitations rules for latent construction defects goes into effect July 1, 2023.

HB 89 by Rep. Maggard was passed by the legislature and is waiting for approval by the governor. HB 89 restricts the ability of building officials and fire marshals to make changes to building plans once a permit has been issued unless the official can show the change is needed to comply with a requirement of the Florida Building Code.

HB 1383 by Rep. Trabulsy was passed by the legislature and is waiting for approval by the governor. HB 1383 extends expiration date of local occupational licenses that will be preempted by the

State of Florida until July 1, 2024, and directs the CILB to create several specialty licenses for trades traditionally regulated only by local governments. This bill does not affect Registered Swimming Pool and Spa Contractor's Licenses or any other swimming pool and spa contractor's license.

During this legislative session FSPA tracked several bills of interest. The final disposition of all bills that FSPA was tracking and working on is listed below.

2023 Bills Final Disposition

Child Water Safety Requirements – DID NOT PASS / SB 74 by Sen. Ana Maria Rodriguez / HB 1541 by Rep. Chambliss.

Requires childcare facilities that provide access to swimming pools or bathing places to have the parents or guardians of children attest in writing whether the child is able to swim or is at risk of injury or death when swimming. Requires that facilities provide U.S. Coast Guard

DIGGING UP IDEAS

All we needed was a handshake

Remember hearing your grandfather or father brag about how "In my day, all we needed was a handshake to close a deal." We are far removed from those days. If you don't

have a contract that covers as many details as possible, you can be in for some very difficult projects. Drawings, addendums, contracts, and warranties all have to be signed and detailed to be able to protect yourself. However, other problems can begin after the job starts. The famous line, "I was told by the salesperson that I would get (fill in the blank)." The famous salesperson promise! In fairness to salespeople, there is also the other remark, "The superintendent told me they would take care of that for me."

The verbal commitments customers refer to are the trickiest to deal with for

owners. We rely on the written contract and print to build a pool and if it's not listed, they don't get it. But the reality can be that the salesperson may have been vague or actually did promise something that wasn't in writing. For these reasons, many other industries have gone to including an additional document to be signed when closing a deal. It is a statement that simply states the salesperson made no other promise other than those listed on the paperwork and are included in the deal. We have this signed by the customer before we start any pool. I dislike having to add paper, but how else do you guard against this situation?

During construction, I insist that any requests from customers be replied back to in writing, or if necessary, we obtain a signature acknowledging the change. For example, customer decides they want to keep a load of dirt from the dig. A week later they change their mind and suddenly forget they asked for this. We require our

super or the excavator to get a signature in print acknowledging the request for dirt or an email sent. Simple things like moving a door pad have come back to bite us because we didn't get a signature for the change and now the customer refers to the original drawing.

We seem to spend as much time shuffling paper as we do building the pool and our customer files are now filled with additional sign offs and copies of emails. I feel as builders, we have no choice but to protect ourselves so we don't have any grey areas when building the pool. I'm sure it's relative to how many pools you build. If you are the one who sells and supervises the pool, you probably don't run into this as often. However, for those who rely on salespeople and superintendents, it seems to come up more frequently. We live in a society now that is very litigious and unfortunately threats of lawsuit or filing complaints with BBB or the state are made.

Florida Swims Foundation and Every Child A Swimmer renew partnership

The Florida Swims Foundation and Every Child A Swimmer (ECAS) renewed their partnership to provide swim lessons to children throughout the state of Florida.

The two organizations signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in February 2023 signifying the commitment of both entities to work together to teach children to swim. The collective goals of this collaboration are to prevent drowning incidents, raise awareness about water safety, and fund swim lessons for children in underserved communities.

"The partnership between the Florida Swims Foundation and Every Child A Swimmer is one that shows just how committed both of our organizations are to ensuring that children all over the state receive life-saving swim lessons free of cost," said Ben Evans, President of the Florida Swims Foundation. "Together, our impact on the swimming literacy of our communities will make Florida and its children more resilient."

Funds are donated through the Florida

Swims Foundation and sent to Every Child A Swimmer for a 100% donation match. Once the donations are received, ECAS allocates funds to vetted swim lesson providers throughout the state.

"It is crucial to us that every child in the state of Florida become a swimmer," said Casey McGovern, Program Manager of Every Child a Swimmer. "It is vital in a state surrounded by water that our children continue to grow and learn in the water as well as on land to keep them not only safe, but also well-rounded."

Since its inception, the Florida Swims Foundation has contributed more than \$260,000 to providing swim lessons throughout Florida communities. The Foundation is the 501(c)(3) arm of the Florida Swimming Pool Association (FSPA), a trade association for Florida's pool and spa industry that currently holds 750 members across 16 chapters.

"It is an essential part of the Florida Swimming Pool Association's values to provide health and safety information to all pool builders, operators, and most importantly, users," said Elizabeth McMurray, Executive Director of the Florida Swimming Pool Association. "We are thrilled that the Foundation and ECAS are able to continue this fruitful partnership and make a positive impact across our state."

In 2022 alone, Every Child A Swimmer awarded \$550,000 to provide swim lessons to children from low-income families. ECAS is the fundraising arm of the International Swimming Hall of Fame (ISHOF), whose mission is to ensure that every child in the world is educated and trained in water safety.

Sales tax exemption on residential pool supplies for the summer

The Florida Legislature approved a massive summer recreational sales tax holiday called the "Freedom Summer Sales Tax Holiday" as part of the State of Florida Budget. The Freedom Summer Sales Tax Holiday gives Floridians a sales tax break on recreation and entertainment products and events entrances purchased between May 29, 2023 and September 4, 2023.

The Sales tax holiday included entrance into to state parks, concerts, entertainment venues and retail sales including outdoor supplies, boating supplies, and residential pool supplies.

Sales tax will not be charged for residential pool and spa replacement parts, nets, filters, lights, and covers with a sales price of \$100 or less and residential pool and spa chemicals purchased by an individual with a price of \$150 or less.

Type II or III personal flotation devices for children unable to swim or at risk of death or injury from swimming when near or interacting with public bathing places or swimming pools. Swim schools are exempt from these requirements. *Status*: SB 74 Died in Health Policy / HB 1541 Died in Children, Families, & Seniors Subcommittee.

Water Safety - DID NOT PASS / SB 84 by Sen. Rodriguez.

Requiring a state park to have a certified lifeguard on duty at designated swimming areas within the park during certain timeframes; requiring the Department of Environmental Protection to install a water rescue station at each designated swimming area; requiring comprehensive age-appropriate and developmentally appropriate 9-12 instruction on water safety, etc. *Status*: SB 84 Died in Education Pre-K-12.

Statute of Limitations for Claims on Improvements to Real Property – PASSED and SIGNED by governor / SB 360 by Judiciary Committee / HB 85 by Regulatory Reform Subcommittee.

Specifies that the statute of limitations for claims based on improvements to real property starts at the issuance of certificate of occupancy, certificate of completion, or date of abandonment of the project whichever is earliest. The statute of limitations is set for four (4) years generally but limits latent claims based on defect not immediately discoverable at the time of completion to seven (7) years. Status: SB 360 PASSED and SIGNED by governor 4/13/2023 / HB 85 Laid on the Table. Substituted for SB360.

Residential Building Permits – DID NOT PASS / SB 682 by Sen. DiCeglie / HB 671 by Rep. Esposito.

Requires local building departments to reduce building permit fees by 75% if a contractor or homeowner elects to use private provider plan review. Reduces the amount of time in which a building department must notify a permit applicant of deficiencies in the application from 10 days to three days. *Status*: SB 682 Died in Community Affairs / HB 671 Died in Administration & Technology Appropriations Subcommittee.

Building Permit Applications to Local Governments – DID NOT PASS / HB 765 by Rep. Roth.

Revises the electronic permit application requirements to include mobile submissions, requires building departments to notice upcoming expiration of permits, requires local governments to list all available permits and necessary documents for permits on their website. *Status*: HB 765 Died in Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee.

Building Construction – PASSED / SB 512 by Sen. Hooper / HB 89 by Rep. Maggard.

Prohibits building officials from making substantive changes to building plans after permit has been issued; provides exceptions; requires building officials to provide certain information to contractors and property owners; provides that building officials are subject to disciplinary action for failure to meet the information requirements.

The bill originally revised the definition of term "class A air-conditioning contractor" to include an expanded electrical scope of work but that provision was removed before final passage of the bill. *Status*: SB 512 Laid on the table, refer to HB 89 / HB 89 Passed House and Senate Ordered Enrolled 5/3/2023. Awaiting Approval from Governor.

Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services – PASSED / SB 1150 by Sen. Ingoglia / HB 1307 by Rep. McClure.

Tort reform legislation effective immediately

Recently Gov. Ron DeSantis quickly signed a bill containing sweeping limits on lawsuits (HB 837).

The tort bill is a priority for DeSantis, Senate President Passidomo and House Speaker

Renner.

"Florida has been considered a judicial hellhole for far too long and we are desperately in need of legal reform that brings us more in line with the rest of the country," DeSantis said in a statement on the bill signing. "I am proud to sign this legislation to protect Floridians, safeguard our economy and attract more investment in our state."

"The vast majority of attorneys work very hard to provide sound legal representation for Floridians in these difficult circumstances," Passidomo added.


"Unfortunately, there are a few bad actors who are in the business to draw out civil cases as long as possible, collecting more and more fees from insurance companies. Litigation drives up the basic costs of goods and services for everyone across all areas of industry and commerce. Under the leadership of Gov. DeSantis, we have taken many steps to help keep Florida affordable for growing families and seniors. This leaislation further those efforts striking the right balance and protect the rights of Floridians who suffer a loss, while at the same time safeguarding everyone else against the hidden costs of prolonged litigation."

The bill makes substantive changes to how lawsuits are filed and litigated in the state, all but eliminating the longstanding statute that allows a policyholder who successfully sues their insurance company to recoup their attorney fees.

The state's recent legal reforms have singularly focused on the property crisis; however, HB 837 more broadly addresses

litigation abuses impacting the business and insurance community. The new laws that immediately became effective with the governor's signature address:

- Transparency in Damages: Requires juries to base damages awards on the actual cost of medical treatment instead of inflated bills.
- Third-Party Bad Faith: Encourages settlements and discourages litigation by requiring third parties to cooperate in good faith and allowing insurers to pay the lesser of policy limits or the demand within 120 days after receiving actual notice of a claim accompanied by sufficient evidence. It also reverses Florida Supreme Court rulings that have led to ordinary negligence being deemed as bad faith.
- Modified Comparative Liability: Promotes personal responsibility by stating that a party that is more than 50 percent at fault for their own injuries may not recover damages from other minimally-at-fault parties but exempts



medical malpractice claims from this new threshold.

- Contingency Risk Multiplier: In 2017, the Florida Supreme Court rejected the federal standard that attorney fee multipliers should only be applied in "rare and exceptional" circumstances, ruling instead that multipliers could be applied in almost any case. This bill restores the award to only rare and exceptional circumstances.
- One-Way Attorney Fees: Reverses
 the system that incentivizes attorneys
 to bring frivolous lawsuits by limiting
 the recovery of one-way attorney fees
 to only named insureds or named
 beneficiaries who are successful in a
 declaratory judgment action seeking a
 determination of coverage against an
 insurer that denied coverage. (New
 language on declaratory judgment
 actions does not apply to property
 insurance cases).
- Statute of Limitations: Reduces the statute of limitations for negligence cases from four years to two years.
- Premises Liability: Provides that in a premises liability case against a property owner when a criminal act of a third party caused the injury, the fault of all persons who contributed to the injury must be considered. It also provides liability protection for multifamily residential properties that implement specific security requirements.

"Thank you, Gov. DeSantis, for signing transformational legislation to end lawsuit abuse," Renner said.

"This legislation prevents frivolous lawsuits and allows good claims to move forward. These reforms make our economy more competitive and Florida more affordable for our citizens and businesses. Thank you to House sponsors Tommy Gregory and Tom Fabricio for your leadership on this bill."

It was the first bill of the 2023 Legislative Session that DeSantis signed. While the governor often calls a press conference to sign legislation, this bill was signed without any fanfare.

But Reps. Fabricio and Gregory, who sponsored the House bill signed by the governor, both attended Friday's closed-door ceremony to sign the measure.

"The reforms Gov. DeSantis signed into law returns Florida's tort system to fundamental American judicial principles that the most responsible pay for the

damages they caused and trusts juries to fairly decide cases," Gregory said.

Added Fabricio, "This legislation brings balance to the system and protects the legal rights of Floridians to access to the courts while reducing the number of frivolous lawsuits."

Sen. Travis Hutson, who sponsored the Senate version of the bill, also released a statement. "For too long Florida families have shouldered the hidden cost of lawsuit abuse as Florida's litigation environment has cost jobs and driven up the cost of goods and services," Hutson said.

"This legislation contains the most meaningful and robust reforms in decades, making numerous changes to Florida's arduous civil system that will provide transparency to jurors, shorten the time people toil away in civil court, and eliminate unfair practices that bad actors have abused."

The bill was championed by insurance and business lobbyists and was opposed by the Florida Justice Association (FJA), which represents the state's trial lawyers. Curry Pajcic, President of the Florida Justice Association, hammered the legislation in a Friday statement.

"The new law does nothing to protect Floridians and everything to protect the profits of billionaire insurance corporations," Pajcic said. "The process by which the sweeping reforms were considered was concerning to the FJA and our members, as well as numerous other parties who publicly opposed the bill at every committee stop in the process."

Prior to the bill becoming law, the


Florida Chamber of Commerce announced it had launched a legal defense fund, anticipating the FJA will challenge the new law in court.

Florida Chamber of Commerce President and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Mark Wilson said in a prepared release that the "personal injury lawyer industry has habitually used the courts to undo the work and intent of the Legislature and the citizens of Florida those elected officials represent."

"This is evidenced by legal challenges to several of the most impactful recent legal reforms in Florida — from workers' comp to medical malpractice to the repeal of joint and several liability and others — which all faced legal delays upon being signed into law," he added.

Over the past few weeks, representatives from the broader business community testified in support of the reforms and highlighted the impacts of frivolous litigation. Some plaintiff attorneys used every tactic in an attempt (unsuccessfully) to pare down the legislation. Once all hope was lost, many of the same attorneys headed home to file as many lawsuits as possible. As reported by the Insurance Journal, Morgan and Morgan stated they would have filed 25,000 lawsuits by the time the bill became law.

As with most legal reforms, the impacts of the legislation may not be felt immediately, but the state took a massive leap forward by rooting out frivolous litigation that has negatively impacted Florida's businesses and consumers for decades.

Revises the definitions of "Category I liquefied petroleum gas dealer" and "Category V LP gas installer" to include the design of LP and natural gas systems. Revises penalties for theft of LP Gas. *Status*: SB 1150 Laid on the table refer to HB 1307 / HB 1307 Passed House and Senate. Ordered Enrolled 4/28/2023. Awaiting Approval from governor.

Interstate-Mobility and Universal-Recognition Occupational Licensing Act – DID NOT PASS / SB 1364 by Sen. Collins / SB 1366 by Sen. Collins / HB 1333 by Rep. Koster.

Requires DBPR Licensing Boards to recognize equivalent out of state occupation licenses for Florida occupational licensing. Allows the board to determine license equivalency via rule. With an amendment by FSPA all applicants for a swimming pool and spa contractor license under this bill must take the appropriate swimming pool trades exam. *Status*: SB 1364 Died on Senate Calendar / SB 1366 Died on Senate Calendar / HB 1333 Died on House Calendar.

Local Occupational Licensing Act – PASSED / SB 1584 by Sen. Perry / SB 1570 by Sen. Hooper / HB 1625 by Rep. Mooney / HB 1383 by Rep. Trabulsy.

Extends the local licensing preemption effective date to July 1, 2024 and requires the CILB to establish certain state specialty licenses by July 1, 2024. Will not affect swimming pool and spa contractor licenses. *Status*: SB 1584 Died in Committee / SB 1570 Laid on the table refer to HB 1383 / HB 1625 Died In Committee / HB 1383 Passed House and Senate. Ordered Enrolled 5/1/2023. Awaiting Approval from governor.

And we could write a book on the goggle review threat. The only thing we have to combat this is to document everything we can so there is no doubt as to what the customer is buying.

I will share a few tips that have come my way. Have your contract reviewed every few years by a contract attorney to make sure it is up to current contract law and lien requirements. Make sure if you use arbitration that it follows the current format for the Arbitration you have selected. Review all documents that either a customer signs or you hand out on a yearly basis. Bottom line, protect yourself as best as you can or it may cost you money.


